have just left 8. pm so I
will give you our news for today
Dad & I waited at the station
until your train left at 10 am.
we were very disappointed that
we could not give you a
farewell wave. however
we realise the difficulty
the station must have had
with no extra trains & so
many passengers. a few
hundred were left sitting
on their cases. to wait patiently

for the 5-40 pm. as that
was the next train for
London & Birmingham.

Dad & I hope Norman & you
had a comfortable and
pleasant journey with
plenty to eat & trust the
Sea was nice & warm.

Dad & I had a snack
lunch at 11-30 am, ~~we~~ We
received a letter from Aunt
saying they were breaking their
journey at Saltcoats & would
arrive here at 5 pm.

I got the Hoover on & Dad
helped to dust so we had.

The work finished by 2³⁰ pm
I then went down to Galbraiths
for Bread & got some lovely
Tomatoes. I was home about
3 pm it was a glorious day
so we had Tea in the garden
just beside the Rose-bed, there
are some lovely Roses out today
Dad went down to the Nursery
to get a lettuce & he came
home with a real beauty
(price 6^d.) & found me having
140 winks in the garden. I
then got my Table set for
Tea so as to have everything
ready for 5 pm. however Dad
& I managed to get another

hour sitting in the sunshine
as it was 5:40 pm when
the family arrived. Their
