(b) To appoint a President, Vice-Presidents, Chairman, Vice-Chairman and Honorary Treasurer.

To appoint an Honorary (or paid) Secretary and Assistant Honorary (or paid) Secretary, Solicitors and such other officers and servants as they shall deem necessary for the proper conduct and management of the affairs of the Association, to hold office during their pleasure and upon such terms as to salary or other remuneration as they

(c) To require a Policy of Indemnity to be entered into for such sum as may be agreed by the Hon. General Secretary and the Hon. Treasurer of the Association and of all its Branches, the cost of such insurance to be borne cyually by the Association and the

(d) To refuse to admit to Membership of the Association any person, and without assigning any reason

(e) To investigate the affairs of any Branch, when, in their opinion, such a course appears necessary, or upon a requisition so to do by the Members of such Branch made in General Meeting. (f) To co-opt as Members of the

To co-opt as Members of

Central Committee not more than two Members of a Branch Committee when dealing with any business affecting that Branch,

(g) To appoint sub-committees and to delegate such powers thereto as the Central Committee may determine.

(h) At any time to summon an Extraordinary General Meeting of the Association.

(i) To expel any Member guilty of misconduct or any act which, in the opinion of the Central Committee, renders him undesirable for continued Membership.

(j) To disband any Branch when such a course is, in their opinion, in the best interests of the Association.

(h) To fill any vacancies that may arise in Central Committee to hold office until the next Annual General Meeting.

(I) To authorise the formation of Area Committees and to frame the necessary rules and regulations governing such Area Committees. 12. PROCEEDINGS OF THE CENTRAL COMMITTEE.—The Central Committee should be shown that the committee of the committee of the committee should be shown to be shown t

13. DISQUALIFICATION FOR MEMBERSHIP OF THE CENTRAL COMMITTEE.

—A Member shall cease to be a Member of the Central Committee, if:

(c) He be found lunatic or become of unsound mind.

(d) He be removed from office by a three-fourths majority of votes in General Meeting.

(e) He ceases to be a Member of the Association.

14. TRUSTEES.—All Freehold and Leasehold Property and Invested Funds of the Association shall be vested in the name of not more than four or less than two Trustees, to be appointed from time to time by the Association in General Meeting. Such Trustees shall hold office until resignation or removal by a three-fourths majority of the votes by Delegates present in General Meeting.

15. General Mertings—

(d) The consideration of any matter of which not less than 28 days' notice in writing has been given to the Hon. Secretary of the Association. Matters

may be raised under the heading of "Other Business," but no voting on such matters can be permitted.

17. ALTERATION OF RULES.—No alteration or addition shall be made to these Rules, except under the authority of a three-fourths majority of Votes at an Extraordinary General Meeting called for the purpose.

18. ANNUAL AUDIT AND ANNUAL REPORT OF THE ASSOCIATION-

(a) The Annual Accounts of the Association (signed by the Chairman and the Hon. Treasurer) with the Auditors' Report thereon, shall be presented to the Members at the Annual General Meeting.

(b) The Annual Report of the Central Committee, together with the Annual Accounts of the Association, shall be printed and circulated to all Branches and a copy shall be supplied to any Member of the Association upon amplication

19. FORMATION OF BRANCHES.—A Branch may be formed on the authority of the Central Committee after application in writing made to it by the persons desirous of forming a Branch (see Part II.). Branches shall elect their own Presidents and Vice-Presidents, subject to the approval of the Central Committee.

Branches may be amalgamated, divided or disbanded by a resolution of a General Meeting of the Branch or Branches concerned, but before such General Meeting the Central Committee shall decide what action is considered necessary for the good of the Association.

20. Administration of each Branch shall be vested in a Branch Committee, Vice-Chairman, Hon. Secretary and Hon. Treasurer and treasurer and the result of the state of the sta

21. Branch Membership. — Any Member of a Branch may be expelled from Membership of that Branch by resolution passed by a three-quarter majority of those present, and voting at any General Meeting of his Branch.

A Report shall be made to the Hon. General Secretary, who will submit it to the Central Committee, who will take such action as to the expulsion of the Member from the Association or transfer to another Branch or Headquarter Roll as they may consider

22. Branch Funds. — Branch Funds shall be held by the Hon. Treasurer of the Branch and administered by the Branch Committee.

23. Branch Rules. — Rules relating to Branches and any amendment thereof shall be submitted to and approved by the Central Committee before being adopted by the Branch in General Meeting.

24. Branch Accounts and Annual Report.—

(a) The Annual Accounts of the Branch (signed by the Chairman and Hon. Treasurer) with the Auditors' Report thereon shall be presented to the Members at the Annual General Meeting (which shall be held not later than the 31st Ianuary).

(b) The Annual Report of the Branch Committee together with the Annual Accounts of the Branch shall be printed and circulated to all Members. (c) A copy of the Annual Report of the Branch together with the Annual Accounts and Auditors' Report shall be forwarded to the Hon. Treasurer of the Association within 21 days of the Annual General Meeting of the Branch at which the Annual Report and Accounts were approved and adopted. 25. Branch Hoots.—Branch Mem.

29. Badges.—Badges are the pro-

perty of the Association. If a recipient ceases to be a Member, the Branch Secretary or the Hon. General Secretary, as the case may be, will take steps to recover the Association Badge.

30. Association Journal. — No item shall be inserted in the Journal unless it has been submitted to the Central Committee for approval, or to such Member or Members appointed
