## **RAF ARRIVE WITH PYJAMAS**

This was the headline that appeared 60 years ago in February 1944, in the manually prepared broadsheet newspaper, which was affixed to a board and regularly circulated through the huts at Stalag 1VB.

Johnny Bushell and Reg Wilson were among the last contingent of RAF POWs to arrive from Dulag Luft transit camp in early February 1944 and we each had a cardboard suitcase supplied to us from the Red Cross when we left for Stalag 1VB.

I do not recall the complete list of contents of the case, but the recent book 'Footprints on the Sands of Time' (which deals with RAF Bomber Command Prisoners of War in Germany 1939-1945) does. The book says that by 1944 'captive parcels' which each prisoner should receive on departure from Dulag Luft for his permanent camp, should be a cardboard box containing the following items:-

1 pair pyjamas6 cakes toilet soap1 cake shaving soap1 carton cigarettes

1 bottle Cascara tablets(100) 1 box chewing gum(20 pkts)

1 roll toilet paper 1 plastic razor 1 sewing kit

1 bottle vitamin tablets(100)

1 toothbrush1 pipe1 hairbrush2 prs shoe laces1 pocket comb

2 bath towels

2 cakes laundry soap1 container tooth powder

3 prs socks-2 prs cotton1 pr wool 1 set underwear(vest ,pants)

1 shoe brush

1 box adhesive compresses 4 pkgs razor blades( 20 blades)

1 can shoe polish 4 handkerchiefs

1 plastic toothbrush case 1 pkg pipecleaners 2 pkgs smoking tobacco

1 pr. slippers 1 sweater

On reflection I do not believe we had all the items listed above (obviously compiled by the American Red Cross) but nevertheless the list makes interesting reading! I do remember however items like cigarettes, tobacco, chewing gum, pipe, toothbrush, razor, sewing kit, pyjamas, underwear etc., but not bath towels, slippers, sweater, Cascara or vitamin tablets! As for 'slippers', my only footwear for three months was a pair of wooden clogs with bits of leather for uppers!(my flying boots were 'stolen' on arrival at 1VB)- after that I got some army boots.
