

FEW AIRCRAFT can have been 'impersonated' with such reverence. Twice now, RAF Canberras have been asked to play the role of the prototype, which made its first flight on May 13, 1946.

Aircraft serial numbers are not the most memorable of items, though some do stick. K954 — the prototype Spitfire is one that trips off many a tongue. Further forward in history, VN799 is another 'magic' number. This was the English Electric A1 prototype which made its first 'tops' at English Electric's airfield at Watton, Lancashire, in the hands of Roland Beaumont, on May 12. The 'main event' was staged on Friday the 13th without any worry about superstition.

The type did not officially adopt the name Canberra until January 1950, but it was known by this name almost from the first flight. 'Whisper'

Establishment beyond the maker's trials and evaluation by the Aeroplane & Armament Experimental Establishment. RAE used VN799 for autopilot development work. Sadly, the aircraft that museums today would fight tooth and nail to possess, came to grief while on approach to Woodbridge, Suffolk, on August 28, 1953. The engines failed with no chance of recovery and the crew of two were killed in the crash.

For the 40th anniversary of the first flight of VN799, the RAF took no chances. It was considered that by the 50th there was every chance that the Canberra would be out of service and that therefore the 40th was 'it'. Two T.45 (WJ877 and WT408) from 231 Operational Conversion Unit at Wyton, Cambridgeshire, were painted up in a version of 'Peter Blue' with 'Circle P' prototype markings and the serial number '10000'

remaining operational Canberras, five reconnaissance PR.95 plus a pair of T.45 (WJ849 and WJ874) with 190 PR.75 in reserve. The plan is that one of the T.45 will take on the blue, prior to adopting the 'new' black and yellow trainer scheme later in 1999.

The 'do' at RAF Watton will be by invite only, making the only public celebration of the 50th anniversary the festival at the Newark Air Museum over the weekend of the 15/16 — see the News pages. It would be nice if, in addition to WK66 (see page 106), the 'Peter blue' example could be seen in the skies over Newark.
