



## SOME WONDERS AND RECORDS OF OUR MODERN WORLD

1. The largest warship in the world is the British Cruiser *Hood*, 43,100 tons, 860 feet long, with a speed of 31 knots.
  2. The world's largest fleet of sailing ships is in the Aoland Islands and belongs to Captain Gustav Ericsson.
  3. The world's fastest and most heavily-armed air fighter is the Hawker Hurricane. The speed is 300-360 m.p.h., but it can do over 400 m.p.h.
  4. The largest commercial air liner is the *Messiahs Clipper*.
  5. The first submarine post office was opened in Bahamas in August, 1939. It is situated in Mr. Williamson's photographic studio.
  6. The longest railway in the world is the Trans-Siberian Railway.
  7. The cleanest city in the world is Tamperefors, the chief industrial town of Finland.
  8. The fastest motor torpedo boat has a speed of over 50 m.p.h., and a range of approximately 1,000 nautical miles when cruising at a speed of 20 knots. It cost £76,000.
  9. The largest office building is the skyscraper of the Radio Corporation of America in New York: it is 70 storeys high.
  10. The largest reflecting telescopes are the two in California: the one at Mount Palomar, with a 200-inch mirror, and the one at Mount Wilson, which has a 100-inch mirror; and a refractor telescope at Palomar, South Africa, with a mirror of 74 inches. Of refractor telescopes, the largest is the 60-inch lens of the one at Yerkes Observatory, Wisconsin.
  11. The highest railway station is that of Monti, South America, which is 15,817 feet high.
  12. The largest park is the Yellowstone National Park, Wyoming, U.S.A., with an area of 3,290 square miles.
  13. The highest cable railway is that of Mont Blanc, which reaches 11,027 feet.
  14. The largest zoo is the London Zoo, which contains some 4,000 animals, costing £15,000 a year for food.
  15. The greatest rain-forest is the Amazonian one, which is 2,500 by 1,500 miles.
  16. Thomas Cook made the first tour round the world in 1872, taking 222 days.
